ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING A TAX SALE WIRE TRANSFER FEE FOR THE LAKE COUNTY TREASURER

WHEREAS, I.C. 36-2-3.5-3 provides that the Lake County Council is the fiscal and legislative body for Lake County, Indiana; and

WHEREAS, I.C. 36-2-3.5-5 provides that the Lake County Council shall pass all ordinances, orders, resolutions and motions for the government of the County in the manner prescribed by I.C. 36-2-4, et. seq.; and

WHEREAS, I.C. 36-1-3-8(a)(6) provides that the Lake County Council has the power to impose a user fee reasonably related to reasonable and just rates and charges for services; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to I.C. 36-2-10-23, notwithstanding any other law, payments to the treasurer for any purpose may be made by cash, check, bank draft, money order, bank card or credit card, electronic funds transfers and any other financial instrument authorized by the Treasurer and the Treasurer shall collect a sum equal to the amount charged from the person who uses the financial instrument; and

WHEREAS, that the Lake County Treasurer is charged an average of \$15.00 in the event a Treasurer's Tax Sale successful bidder desires to pay by wire transfer.

NOW, THEREFORE, LET IT BE ORDAINED AS FOLLOWS:



2. That the fees collected shall be deposited in the Lake County General Fund, to be appropriated by the Lake County Council, or as otherwise provided by law.


